Dear Family,

While I sit here waiting
for a chance to go over a draft of
Constitution of the Neutral Conference to
which Mme. Scherwinna I have been
working up, with her before getting
types written, I will get a note ready
for the American mail. Miss Elle
Ericson (Russian subject) Mr. Root
(American, member of our force)

Received this morning from G. Moberg
whom we arrived yesterday, p. m. on a
steamer from Rotterdam. Since I said
you I have among the letters about

two crossed the North Sea. Our
headquarters are now here at Stockholm.
The best plan to meet for several
business, but you may perhaps move
around from one Scandinavian capital
to another. This is an easy place to
get out of - the safest region to sail
from for America etc. I have explained
to you before that our supporters here are
not the military class and not pro German
but the other.

After long negotiations the main
party - ^{German} some twenty people including the
force - managed to get through Germany,
but Germany was a bit difficult about it.
I think the military people caught here

disapprove of our going on and are
afraid of us.

The organizing of the conference is going
ahead now. I hope that a week or two will
see it sitting. Scandinavian ^(Danes, Swedes, and Norwegians) and
American delegates are ^{now} at present, and
the Dutch elective body, is in process
of organization. We have fought on
