Mise sur pied en septembre 1915 sous le commandement du Major R. P. Rogers.
Autorisation publiée dans l'ordre général 151 du 22 décembre 1915.
Mobilisée à Pembroke, Ontario.
Recrutée dans les centres miniers de l'Ontario, du Québec, de la Nouvelle-Écosse et du Nouveau-Brunswick. Obtient aussi des mineurs enrôler dans les bataillons d'infanterie.
Quitte Saint John le 1^{er} janvier 1916 à bord du METAGAMA.
Arrive en Angleterre le 10 janvier 1916.
Effectifs : 14 officiers, 270 autres grades.
Arrive en France le 16 février 1916.
Cesse d'exister le 12 juillet 1918, et le personnel est transféré aux *4th, 5th, 6th, 7th, 8th et 9th Battalions, Canadian Engineers*.
Démantelée en vertu de l'ordre général 192 du 1^{er} novembre.
